Computer Forensics A Practical Guide for Lawyers

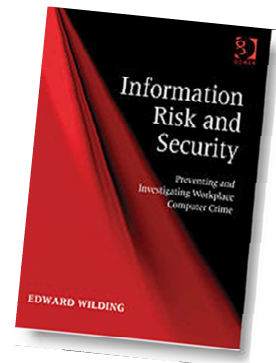
